

#### In Memory Of Arthur "Earl" Washburn



Officers Evans and Jenkins discussed detailed level 1 and level 2 truck inspections and Lt. Belcher discussed OSHP's efforts with Truckers Against Trafficking. We were able to see first-hand the tractor trailer that had been used to smuggle cocaine, that was subsequently seized by the Patrol under Ohio's Drug Offender Law.



Lt. Anderson explained how the unit is now being used in an OSHP public relations campaign. People were able to tour the academy and learned about a day in the life of a cadet, including where they eat, train and sleep. Hats off to the Ohio State Highway Patrol for all they do for the trucking industry.


#### June Corporate Driver Of The Month (Emmanuel Kemp)
